University Will Use Portable Disinfection Carts in Labs

### CHALLENGE

One of the world's leading research universities, Rochester has a long tradition of breaking boundaries. Their collective efforts to respond to COVID-19 and plan for the future are informed by seven guiding principles. The first is "The health and safety of our students, faculty, staff, patients, and guests are our highest priority". The university formed a COVID-19 Preparedness and Response Team in the spring to develop policies and procedures for the campus. "We intend to provide a safe environment for all students to pursue their studies in a setting designed to protect their health and safety while ensuring academic quality," Brian Stogner, president of the university, said.

### SOLUTION

The university cleans classrooms between classes and purchased four portable UV carts to disinfect laboratories. UVC disinfection has been in use in medical facilities since the 1930s. It has been acknowledged as deactivating the SARS-CoV-2 virus that causes COVID-19 by both the scientific and medical communities. The portable units have a 3-year warranty, and even have a wifi bridge to track usage.

### RESULT

The University utilized the Oakland Schools Cooperative Contracts Network (OSCCN) to speed the procurement process and get materials on site as soon as possible. The goal of OSCCN is to save time and money by providing more choices in cooperative purchasing. This service, previously available to Oakland County districts only, is now available to public schools, private schools, charter schools/public school academies, colleges, universities, other post-secondary institutions, city, township, village government, county, state government agencies and non-profit organizations in Michigan.
